Yes, we are a service organization, and last year we raised \$15,000 for our beneficiaries. But we also are a social group, building community through getting together to work on projects, sharing time and having fun.

And now we have a club social director: Sheri Hendrickson is helping us to find and develop more opportunities to get together.

The last weekend of April, the club had a big day of engagement on multiple events in multiple locations. April 27, we held the club's inaugural Cars and Coffee event in Santee. It was open to all brands, 34 cars in all, with 41 people attending. The Mopar club had a great showing, with 25 Mopars, classic and modern.

From that location, 20 club cars left for a cruise through the back country, stopping at a viewpoint overlook, a brewery, doing a little wine tasting, and of course, a stop at Dudley's Bakery. Twenty-nine members finished the day at Casa Signorelli for a barbecue. It was a fantastic day and fun for all.

That same day, on the other side of the county, there were seven faithful members working on the DePauw Dart restoration project, which is coming along nicely and is almost finished. In addition, five members represented the club at the services for longtime member Ed Kohler, held in Lakeside on April 29.






