For over three decades, Point Loma Nazarene University has sent student mission teams to partners in ministry with churches around the world. Love-Works teams are composed of well-trained volunteers who come alongside our hosts to serve as the hands and feet of Christ.

We believe that short-term missions are only meaningful when they support and strengthen the longterm work already established within local communities. Our role is one of presence, encouragement, and humble service, following the leadership and direction of our hosts.

Each three-week trip consists of teams of 10–12 students and two co-leaders who commit to over three months of preparation and training. This training process is shaped by what we have learned from our global partners. Through this experience, students develop cross-cultural awareness and skills that last a lifetime, ultimately reshaping how they engage with and relate to the world.

If you are reading this, I am likely deep in the East African country of Kenya. This marks my third trip through the LoveWorks program. I am traveling with eight students and one co-leader to the area surrounding Nairobi, often referred to as part of the cradle of civilization. Our work will focus on educating the Maasai community on women's health issues. We will spend three weeks serving in and around the local area.

Why share this in a club newsletter? I hope it encourages us to reflect on two important realities.

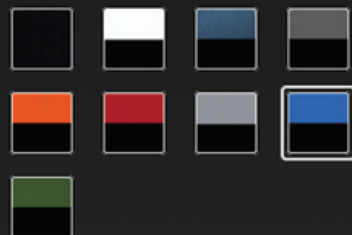

Stellantis employee gets ticket for parking Plymouth in company lot

Atop Stellantis North American headquarters, presiding over Auburn Hills as a testament to the storied automotive history of the metro Detroit region, is a five-pointed logo called the Pentastar. The same logo sits in ornamental fashion on the hood of Devin Sykes' daily driver, a 1987 Plymouth Gran Fury.

"It's a car that was built during the Iacocca era, and he really brought back like the corporate badge, the Pentastar, and it's just all over the car," Sykes said.

So when Sykes, an electric vehicle engineer at Stellantis, drove his car to work at Stellantis HQ, he parked with a



little bit of pride in a preferred parking spot. Sykes is a longtime gearhead who has driven many a quirky vehicle,

But after work, Sykes told the *Detroit Free Press*, "There was a ticket on my windshield, and the first thing I did was laugh out loud." Sykes was ticketed for parking a competitor's vehicle in a company-car spot — a practice in place at most automotive HQs. The problem here is that Plymouth is, indeed, among the historical Stellantis family of brands — founded by Walter Chrysler himself in 1928 before folding in 2001. Stellantis itself is a conglomerate of companies that includes Chrysler, Dodge, Jeep and Ram.

Sykes' ticket was resolved quickly. He said

he spoke to a security director the next morning who did not even enter the ticket into the computer system. "I knocked on the door (of the security team's room), and a guy popped out, and I just said, 'Hey, are you the person I contest parking tickets with?' He didn't really say anything, and I handed him the ticket. He looked down at it, and he just said, 'Plymouth.'" Sykes said the man had a wry smile on his face, and nobody hassled anyone.

Stellantis' competitive vehicle parking rules, which stipulate that only Stellantis vehicles can take convenient parking spaces on the automaker's property. The rule is not new, nor is it abnormal. Stellantis officials, when asked about the uproar over the "tickets," said the rules are the rules.

The tickets, to be sure, don't come with a fee and are essentially just warnings issued by the security team at Stellantis.

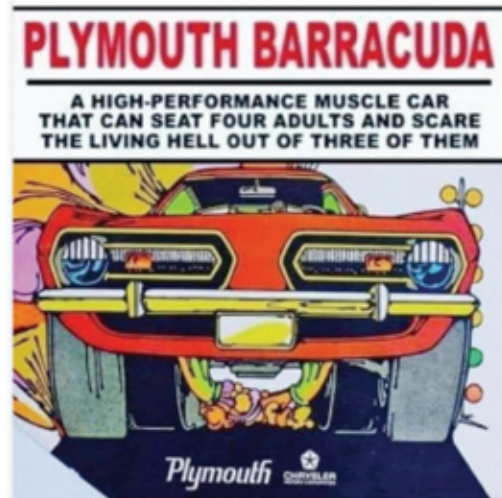
